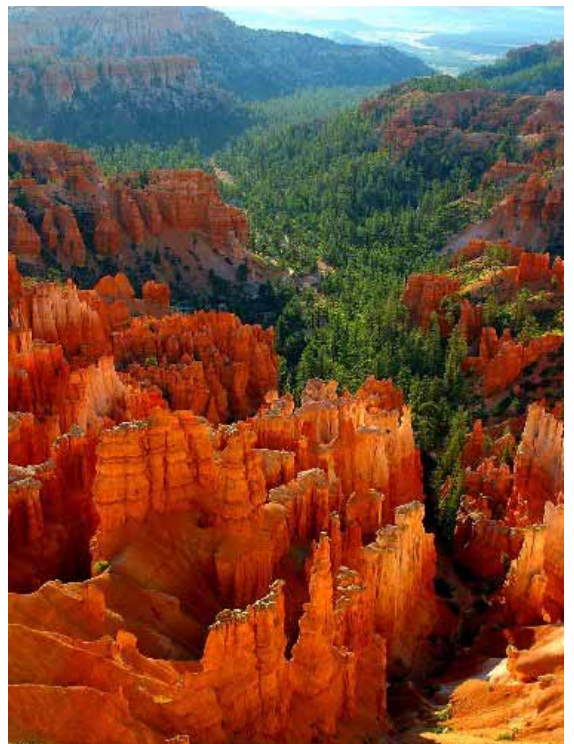


# Pioneer Adventures of the old West MAY 9 - 17, 2010

### **Day 1 - Arrive Phoenix – Scottsdale**

After landing at Phoenix International Airport, you'll transfer to your hotel in **Scottsdale** where you'll meet your Tour Director. Meet your fellow travelers at 6:00pm for a **Kick-off Party**. *Hotel: Embassy Suites Phoenix*

### **Day 2 - Scottsdale – Sedona – Flagstaff**

Today your Tour Director reveals a **Hidden Treasure**. A drive through the Sonoran Desert brings you to **Montezuma Castle National Monument**, one of the best preserved cliff dwellings in North America. Take a minute to ponder the Sinagua Indians' life here in the desert before heading to Sedona, in spectacular "Red Rock Country." Climb into 4WD Jeeps for a rip-roarin' ride into spectacular **Dry Creek Basin**. After a stunning drive through Oak Creek Canyon, arrive in Flagstaff, a former Route 66 outpost. This evening you'll visit the **Lowell Observatory**, a National Historic Landmark, where Pluto was discovered in 1930. Truly, your first day here in the West has been out of this world! (B, D) *Hotel: Radisson Woodlands Hotel*

### **Day 3 - Flagstaff – Grand Canyon Railway – Grand Canyon National Park**

Climb aboard the historic **Grand Canyon Railway**, you'll pass through majestic Ponderosa Pines, the high desert and the Kaibab National Forest while hearing tall tales and folklore about the area. Keep your eye out for wildlife – it's not uncommon to spot elk, mule-deer and pronghorn antelope sauntering about in this wild and woolly region. Nothing on earth can prepare you for the **Grand Canyon**, one of the natural wonders of the world. As the sun sets and shadows dance mysteriously in the Grand Canyon, join your Tour Director for an unforgettable walk along the rim. (B) *Hotel: National Park Lodges*

### **Day 4 - Grand Canyon – Monument Valley – Lake Powell**

Drive along Desert View Drive, featuring jaw-dropping views of the Grand Canyon, before entering **Navajo Country**. Here you can poke around the Historic Cameron Trading Post and hunt for a great piece of Southwest Native American art. Next stop: the **Code Talkers** Exhibit in Kayenta. Learn how the Navajos were one of America's greatest secret weapons in WWII and why GIs were ordered to protect the Wind Talkers with their lives. Your exciting day ends at a lakeside resort at **Lake Powell**. (B, D) *Hotel: Lake Powell Resort*

### **Day 5 - Lake Powell**

Enjoy a free day to roam the range. Optional activities include a fun float down one of the most beautiful stretches of the Colorado River, a cruise on spectacular Lake Powell to Antelope Canyon with views of Glen Canyon Dam or to Rainbow Bridge, one of the most photographed geological wonders in the American West. Or maybe you'll dive into some of the many aquatic activities at Lake Powell Marina – the choice is yours! (B)

### **Day 6 - Lake Powell – Zion National Park – Bryce Canyon National Park**

We reckon you'll be awestruck by the towering cliffs and massive canyon walls of **Zion Canyon**. Riding the park's shuttle, marvel at how the Virgin River cuts through the sandstone to create one of Mother Nature's most stupendous wonders. Leaving Zion, drive along the Mount Carmel Highway for spectacular views of Zion Canyon, the **Great Arch of Zion** and the distinctive **Checkerboard Mesa**. Soon you'll arrive at historic Ruby's Inn at **Bryce Canyon** for the last two nights of your Wild West adventure. (B) *Hotel: Ruby's Inn*

### **Day 7 - Bryce Canyon National Park**

Exploring **Bryce Canyon** is like entering a weird and eerie world, with sandstone spires called "hoodoos" creating a landscape that is a playground for the imagination. Explore the rim of a great amphitheater stopping at various look-outs to snap pictures of fairytale castles, wondrous cathedrals, meandering trails and secret hideaways, all carved out of stone by Mother Nature. This afternoon you're free to blaze your own trail. Then put on your cowboy boots and Stetsons for a **Farewell Cowboy Dinner** filled with good food and good fun. (B, D)

### **Days 8 & 9 - Bryce – Las Vegas**

Traveling down through the scenic **Virgin River Gorge**, make your way into southern Nevada and to fabulous **Las Vegas**, where a different kind of adventure awaits you. Tonight we will stay at the *Monte Carlo Resort and Casino* on the famous Strip of Las Vegas. Unfortunately, all good things must come to an end. Transfer (on your own) to the airport for your flight home.

### Documents

A valid government issued photo I.D. is required for this departure.

### Payment

A deposit of \$200 per person will confirm your reservation. The balance is due to AAA by February 19, 2010.

### Cancellation Penalties:

### Clothing/Climate

Average temperatures for May are in the 80's with cooler evenings. Daytime, casual clothes and comfortable walking shoes are recommended.

### Baggage

One suitcase per person is allowed. You may also bring a small carry-on bag. Baggage fees and other charges may be directly assessed by the airlines or airports.
