Fly from **Harrisburg** to **Fairbanks**. Transfer to hotel for two nights accommodations.

Day 2 - Fairbanks

Board the sternwheeler *DISCOVERY III* for a narrated scenic cruise on the Chena and Tanana Rivers.

Day 3 - Fairbanks / Denali

Getting to Denali is unforgettable aboard the McKinley Explorer - Holland America's domed railcars. Whistle into Denali National Park for a taste of life in the wild.

Day 4 - Denali National Park (Mt. McKinley)

Original, signed passport valid for 6 months beyond stay, and with at least one blank Visa page for Visa stamp(s).

A deposit of \$300 per person will confirm your reservation. The balance is due to AAA by March 18, 2010.

### *Insurance*

Alaska is not a frigid land of ice and snow! The interior around Fairbanks is warm during summer. Pack for a variety of temperatures: layers work best. Daytime, casual clothes and comfortable walking shoes are fine. For cruising, evenings require casual or semi-formal attire, with two formal nights.

### *Baggage*

Two bags per person are allowed. In addition, a small carry-on is recommended. Baggage fees and other charges may be directly assessed by airlines or airports.
