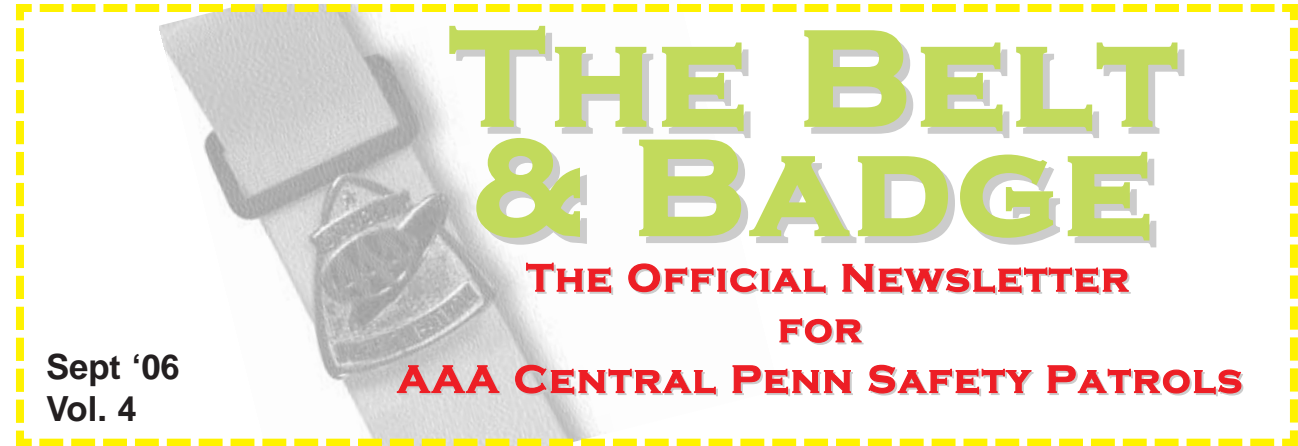

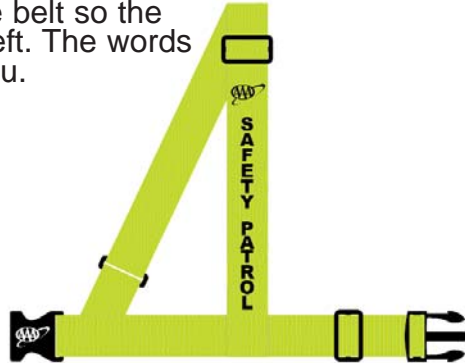

Wearing the Belt and Badge Properly

As Patrollers take their posts, it is important that they are wearing their belts and badges correctly. A sloppy appearance detracts from the authority figure Patrollers are meant to portray. The easiest way to make sure your Patrollers understand how to wear their belts is to demonstrate the simple technique illustrated here.

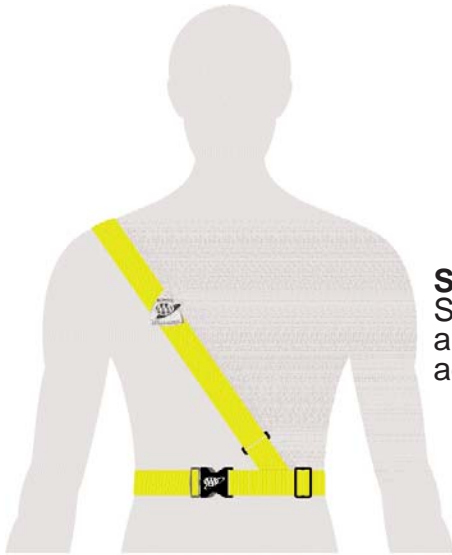
Step 1

Unhook the waist belt and hold the belt so the shoulder strap goes from right to left. The words "Safety Patrol" should be facing you.



Step 2

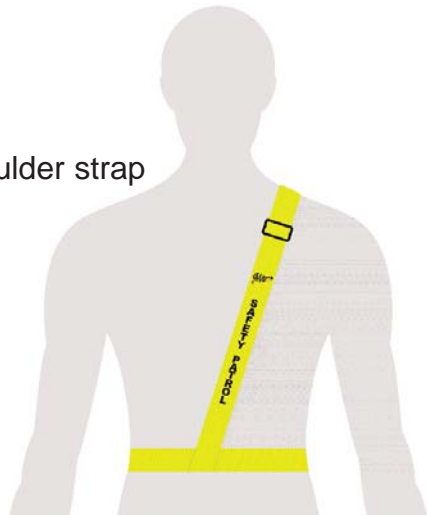
Slide the shoulder strap through your left arm and over your head. Buckle the waist belt and adjust the shoulder strap (if needed).

Step 3

Pin badge on shoulder strap



View from front
